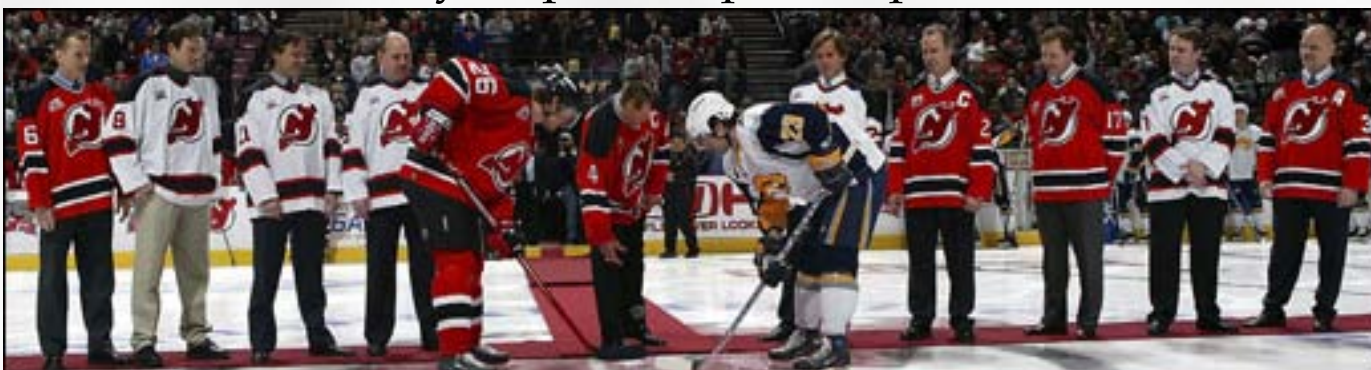

The Lowell Devils enjoyed a strong month of hockey since the All-Star Break, going 8-3-2-1 during February. Playing 14 games over a 27-day span, the Devils vaulted themselves from the bottom of the division right into the thick of the playoff hunt, tied with the Worcester Sharks for the fourth and final Atlantic Division playoff spot. The stage is set for a battle for the Calder Cup Playoffs over the final month and a half, with five games against the Portland Pirates (who trail Lowell by just two points), five games against the third-place Providence Bruins, and two games against the Sharks in the final week of the regular season.

Chris Minard continues to pace the offense for Lowell, and his 23 goals and 34 points lead the club. Dan McGillis (9g-12a-21pts, +10) and David Clarkson (15g-16a-31pts, +8, 128 PIM) are tied for second on the team in scoring. G Scott Clemmensen came up with a big 35-save shutout against Worcester in his one-game assignment from New Jersey on February 21st. Meanwhile, rookie G Jordan Parise is hot as well, the Devils have lost just once in regulation in his last eight starts dating back to mid-January. Defense has been strong all season for the Devils, who rank 6th in the AHL in goals allowed.

The Trenton Titans battled call-ups and injuries, but in going 6-7-0 in the month of February, were able to maintain their place in second in the North Division. Now at 26-22-5 on the year, Trenton sits three points behind the Cincinnati Cyclones with 19 games left in the regular season schedule.

It was a stellar month for left wing Scott Bertoli, who totaled seven goals and 14 assists over an eleven-game point-scoring streak that rode from February 3 through February 24. The Titans' captain also reached a personal milestone on February 24, registering the 500th point of his professional career during a four-point performance (2g, 2a) in a 7-1 win over the Cyclones. In the same game, center Jim Henkel notched a power play tally for his 100th goal as a pro.

While currently on assignment with the Lowell Devils, left wing Mike Pandolfo made Titans' history this past month, when he gathered his 36th goal of the season on February 16 against the Johnstown Chiefs. Pandolfo broke the Titans' record for goals scored in a season, set by Matt Zultek in 2003-04.

The month of March will see the Titans play nine of their fifteen games on the road as they fight for a spot in the postseason and the North Division crown.
